Pre-Hospital Emergency Medicine Trainees' Association (PHEMTA)

Dear All,

I hope that you are enjoying your PHEM training and for those of you who have sat the Diploma last week that it has gone well.

The PHEM Trainees' Association was founded in late 2014 to represent current and recently completed PHEM trainees to IBTPHEM and external bodies. It has a small committee consisting of Chairman (me), Vice Chairman (James Chinery), and representatives to the three Committees of IBTPHEM - Assessments (Jon Birks), Curriculum (Damian Keene) and Training (Philip O'Donnell). PHEMTA puts forward a trainees' perspective at all levels of IBTPHEM, however it has been difficult to get an accurate picture of trainees' areas of concern or indeed where training is working well. We have not had regular contact with you all individually, and for this we apologise. Our plan is to change this to improve the functioning of PHEMTA, ensure it is representing you adequately, and to have an avenue for communications that are useful to all.

Some examples of the work of PHEMTA so far

- Proposing, organising and conducting bi-annual trainee survey. This is the main way thethe the IBTPHEM Committees and, most importantly, the IBTPHEM Board understand what PHEM is like for you, the trainees.
- Raising concerns about workplace-based assessments leading to publication of a document from the Training Committee helping to guide trainees
- Giving trainee representation to the working group for logbook development
- Currently liaising with the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh to address concerns about fees for membership and election following the FIMC

Monthly newsletter

This is the inaugural PHEMTA monthly newsletter. I hope it will come out in the last week or so of each month and will be an opportunity for us to share any updates with you such as reports from recent meetings, as well as being an avenue of communication between you all. I hope that the newsletter will also provide an informal route of communication from TPDs and IBTPHEM regarding training opportunities and other updates. If there are sufficient trainees attending, we aim to provide an educational element to the open part of the meeting, perhaps exploring some of the more contentious clinical issues in pre-hospital care along with looking at what opportunities exist for you after PHEM training.
