What is Wild Trials?

Wild Trials is an annual national event where University Wilderness Medicine Societies compete in a range of pre-hospital scenarios conducted in the austere or non-permissive environment.

Where and When?

Liverpool University Wilderness Medical Society will be hosting this year's trials at Atlcar Ranges, Merseyside over the weekend 3rd to 5th April 2020. Over 120 student delegates are expected to enter with teams of four rotating through two days of tasking activity.
