2 Aims

- 2. To promote and facilitate the integration of UC Provision into a care system.

Not a qualification to practice urgent care but provides evidence of comparable multi-professional development in a standardised format.

Track Record in Multi-professional Career Development

Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh (RCSEd) started diploma in 1988, FPHC running since 1996, multi-professional exam 1998. Strong history of multi-professional working

GMC sub-speciality of Pre-Hospital Emergency Medicine (PHEM) 2011. Intercollegiate application and ongoing supervision.

Curriculum (see diagram attached) for PHEM developed – 10 themes http://www.ibtphem.org.uk/curriculum/

PHEM is based around systems of care (Chain of survival and Regional Trauma Systems). Learning from systems of care could be used to develop Urgent Care.

Development Process.
