FPHC Diploma in Major Incident Management (DipMIM)

For the first time, achieve a recognised qualification relevant to your role!

This Diploma is aimed at all those involved in the planning for, or organisation of, a major incident response above that of your own area of professional expertise.

The emphasis is on the organisational and regulatory framework of major incident management rather than clinical aspects, although these do form part of the syllabus where such knowledge is essential to the provision of an appropriate response.


