Would you like to represent your region within the Faculty of Pre-hospital Care?

Applications are now open for enthusiastic individuals to represent various regions across the UK.

Regional representatives are vital to the delivery of the aims of the Faculty. Their main role is to co-ordinate and promote high quality education and teaching in pre-hospital care, as well as effectively integrate the efforts of all participants in pre-hospital care in their respective regions. They work closely alongside our Regional Student Representatives to achieve this.

Representatives can be from any professional background involved in the delivery of prehospital care, and at any level of training / practice. They are nominated for a period of 3 years and report to the FPHC Regional Group Chair, Dr Natalie Lonsdale. Representatives must be FPHC Members in Good Standing to apply for these positions.

This is not about you doing lots of additional work to set up events yourself!

It is about sharing and promoting the high-quality education and teaching in pre-hospital care which we know is already taking place and making it accessible to more people. This supports the FPHC mission of effectively integrating the efforts of all participants in pre-hospital care.

As you will see from the activity in other regions, we aim to deliver a mix of face-to-face events which we can help advertise as well as some online events open to a wider audience. We provide access to an enhanced Zoom platform to facilitate these events and hope that by each region contributing we can have an exciting annual programme.



Role Description

Responsibilities include:

- 1. Contributing to co-ordination and promotion of educational events in their areas
- 2. Actively sharing information with FPHC to enable update of regional web pages
- 3. Promoting other resources on the FPHC website, for example exams and accreditation, being cognisant of the fact that this is now all multidisciplinary
- 4. Engaging with relevant practitioners and groups in the region, for example:
 - Links with universities such as representing FPHC at University Open days ideal to do with Student Rep's and especially with progress in some areas integrating PHEM into the undergraduate curriculum
 - Participation in undergraduate teaching opportunities and link with undergraduate schemes
 - Engaging with regional Major Trauma Networks and sharing educational / M&M meeting details via the web page
 - Encouraging PHEM trainees, especially at completion of their training programmes to contribute to the regional groups, and making contact via the Training Programme Directors to welcome any new PHEM trainees to the region
 - Events teams and voluntary aid groups
 - Ensuring close links with local operational BASICS Schemes and seeking agreement for links to those schemes to be on the regional web pages, along with any opportunities for interested folk to get practical experience.

How to Apply

Complete the application form and answer the following questions, with each answer being 200 words or less:

- o Why would you like to be appointed as regional representative for your region?
- o What relevant experience do you have that would be make you an ideal candidate for this role?
- o What would you hope to achieve during your tenure as regional representative?



There is a requirement that you are a Member of the FPHC in Good Standing to be eligible for these roles.

Applications will be reviewed and in the event of multiple applications for any region, applicants may be invited to interview. The role need not be exclusive – as you will see form other regions, some have small groups of practitioners contributing to the regions in shared roles.
